

The Falcons Ladies Football Club was founded in 2016 with a clear vision and purpose: to provide opportunities for young women in the Stellenbosch area and beyond to participate in football and promote their personal development. The club emerged from a desire to create a platform that focused solely on the growth and empowerment of female footballers.

Recognizing the lack of representation and opportunities for women in football, a group of passionate individuals came together to establish the Falcons Ladies Football Club. Their aim was to provide a safe and supportive environment for young girls to pursue their passion for the sport, while also fostering important life skills and values.

We are registered as a Non-Profit Organisation (NPO) and Non-Profit Company (NPC). This registration demonstrates the club's commitment to operating with transparency, accountability, and compliance with legal requirements.

The NPO registration number for the Falcons Ladies Football Club is 251-886 NPO, which signifies its status as a recognized non-profit entity. This registration ensures that the club adheres to the guidelines and regulations set forth by the Department of Social Development.

Additionally, the club is registered as a Non-Profit Company under the NPC Act, with the registration number 2020/180/106/08 NPC. We hold a Level 1 B-BBEE Status with a 135% Business Procurement Recognition. This registration further reinforces the club's commitment to its non-profit objectives and aligns it with the legal framework governing non-profit entities in South Africa under the Company's Act, Act 71 of 2008.



It also enables the club to access certain benefits and opportunities available to registered non-profit organisations and companies.

Furthermore, we are also affiliated with SAFA Cape Winelands, the regional football body and FIFA. This affiliation strengthens the club's connection to the broader football community and provides opportunities for participation in official competitions and events locally and internationally.

By having a registered status and affiliation, the Falcons Ladies Football Club solidifies its position as a recognised and legitimate entity within the football & community landscape. It affirm the club's commitment to its mission and values, and its dedication to the development and empowerment of women in football.

In 2019, the Falcons Ladies Football Club achieved a significant milestone by participating in the Gothia Cup in Gothenburg, Sweden. This historic moment marked the first time that our talented young girls had the opportunity to travel by airplane and compete internationally, representing not only our club but also the province of the Western Cape, but South Africa by being the first female soccer team in the new millennium from South Africa to participate in the prestigious Gothia Cup. This international exposure provided our players with valuable experience and contributed to their personal growth as footballers.

The Gothia Cup is renowned as the world's largest youth soccer tournament, hosting teams from 80 different countries. Despite facing funding constraints, we proudly sent a team of 13 dedicated players to showcase their skills and passion on the international stage. Our team displayed exceptional talent and determination, advancing to the round of 16 in our age group. While we unfortunately did not progress further in the knockout round, we held our heads high, knowing that we had represented our club and community with pride. Our journey to the Gothia Cup was not without its challenges, as we faced the stigma and prejudice that often accompanies being from a farming community. We defied the notion that our potential was limited, proving that we could compete on a global scale.

It is important to highlight the background of our players, many of whom come from underprivileged circumstances. They come from households headed by grandparents, single mothers, and non-relatives serving as guardians. Despite these challenges, our players have shown incredible resilience and determination, using football as a vehicle for personal growth and empowerment.

The Falcons Ladies Football Club's participation in the Gothia Cup not only showcased our players' skills and dedication but also demonstrated the power of football to transcend barriers and provide opportunities for young girls. This success story serves as a testament to the talent, strength, and unity that defines our club, as we continue to uplift and empower our players within the Stellenbosch community and beyond.









After our remarkable performance in the Gothia Cup 2019, the Falcons Ladies Football Club caught the attention of José Cabral the Head of Youth & Community Development at Stellenbosch FC (SFC), a prominent Premier Soccer League (PSL) team in the local football scene. Recognising the talent and expertise within our club, the Mr Cabral approached our Head Coach and Assistant Coach to lead the coaching efforts for their High School Development team.

The team comprised of a diverse group of players, including seven talented individuals from the Falcons Ladies Football Club, five players from Glen Eagles, and four non-club football players. These remarkable young women, hailing from Cloetesville High School, Rhenish Girls High School, and Stellenzicht Secondary, came together to form a formidable force. In an exciting international friendly match, we faced a mixed team of Curro National students, including international players.

This collaboration with Stellenbosch FC and the opportunity to participate in high-level coaching and matches has been an ongoing project, aiming to nurture and develop the skills of promising young players. Unfortunately, the progression of this initiative was temporarily halted due to the outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic, which impacted the sporting landscape worldwide.

Despite the interruption caused by the pandemic, we remain committed to resuming and furthering this valuable project with Stellenbosch FC in the near future. The experience gained from coaching the High School Development team has provided our coaches with invaluable insights and expertise, which they bring back to our own Falcons Ladies Football Club. We continue to harness the potential of our players, providing them with opportunities to grow and succeed both on and off the field. It serves as a testament to our commitment to nurturing talent and contributing to the overall development of women's football in the Cape Winelands region.

While the cancellation was disappointing, it did not diminish the impact of this incredible opportunity. The Falcons Ladies Football Club remains grateful to ENVEST, the Embassy of the United States of America, and VCU for their partnership and dedication to our players' holistic development.

Though our players were unable to travel to the USA as planned, the experience of being selected for such a prestigious program has left an indelible mark on their lives. The recognition of their potential, the preparation they undertook, and the anticipation they felt have instilled in them a sense of pride and motivation to continue pursuing their dreams.

The Falcons Ladies Football Club views this partnership as a stepping stone to future opportunities for our players. We will continue to nurture their talents, provide them with guidance and support, and seek partnerships that enable them to excel academically, professionally, and athletically.

While the Covid-19 pandemic may have disrupted our plans temporarily, the Falcons Ladies Football Club remains steadfast in our commitment to empowering our players and helping them reach their full potential. CURRENT CLUB NEEDS

The Falcons Ladies Football Club has identified several key areas where assistance is needed to fulfill our mission & vision and support the development of our players. These current needs are vital to ensuring the continued growth and success of our club:

1. Transport:

Transportation to and from the field poses a significant challenge for our club members. Many of our players face difficulties accessing reliable transportation, often lacking the means to pay for public transport. This hampers their participation and attendance at training sessions and matches. Currently, a single away match to Worcester costs our team R 2,800.00, which strains our already limited budget. We kindly request support in the form of transport sponsorship to ensure the consistent and punctual attendance of our players. This is our most urgent and critical need.

2. Training and Playing Facilities:

Presently, our access to suitable training facilities is limited. We seek assistance in securing adequate and appropriate training and playing grounds for our team. This includes access to fields in the Stellenbosch Central Business District and other necessary amenities that facilitate effective training sessions and match day activities.

3. Training Equipment:

To enhance the quality of our training sessions and promote skill development, we require training equipment such as cones, agility ladders, training bibs, and balls. The provision of these resources would greatly benefit our players and contribute to their overall growth as footballers.

4. Team Kits:

With our club growing steadily, we are in need of new team kits, specifically two sets of 50 kits for home and away matches. Our current kits are nearing the end of their lifespan and no longer meet the required standards for our team. Our current playing kit was bought in August of 2021. Sponsoring new kits would not only boost team morale but also enhance the overall image and professionalism of our club.

5. Post-Match Nutrition:

Prioritizing the well-being of our players, we aim to provide them with a nutritional meal, snack, or fruit after matches or practice sessions. We request support in the form of sponsorships or partnerships with local businesses that can provide healthy food options to aid in recovery and promote proper nutrition.

6. Water and Energy Supplements:

Hydration and energy replenishment are crucial during training and matches. Access to clean drinking water and energy supplements, such as electrolyte drinks or energy bars, would greatly benefit our players' performance and overall well-being. We kindly seek support in providing these essential supplies.

7. First Aid Kits:

The safety and health of our players are paramount. Therefore, we require three fully equipped First Aid Kits that is dedicated to Soccer to ensure immediate medical attention in case of injuries during training sessions or matches. Support in obtaining these kits would contribute to the overall well-being and safety of our team members.

By addressing these current needs, we can provide our players with the necessary support and resources to excel in their football journey. We believe that investing in their development will not only benefit them individually but also empower them to become active and valuable members of our community. We welcome any assistance, sponsorships, or partnerships (internal and or external) to help us fulfil these needs and continue making a positive impact on the lives of our players.
